Liam Bartlett

60 Minutes reporter/presenter



One of Perth's foremost investigative journalists Liam had been involved in the WA media industry for over 20 years when he was offered the prized role as reporter on the prestigious *60 Minutes* program following the death of Richard Carlton around 15 years ago.

During his first assignment for *60 Minutes* he and his cameraman were almost killed by incoming Katyusha rockets in Israel during the Israeli-Hezbollah war, he was also bombed in Beirut and has covered war zones in Syria, Iraq, Afghanistan and South Ossetia. He was also tear gassed on the West Bank, stoned by a mob in Nigeria, been lost in the middle of the Congo and in a car rollover on the frozen plains of Siberia.

On a more positive note he has interviewed prime ministers, presidents and international celebrities such as Tom Hanks, Tom Jones, Billy Crystal, Beyonce, Rod Stewart, Alicia Keys, Jack Black, Shania Twain, Dame Helen Mirren and many others.
